The Churches on-the-Hill Food Bank was established in 1998 by the eight churches along the St. Clair corridor between Mount Pleasant and Spadina.

The mission of the Churches on-the-Hill Food Bank is to supplement the basic food needs of our clients by providing nutritionally balanced food items in a safe and welcoming space. Clients will be treated with respect and will be provided with items most appropriate for themselves, their family, their culture and their religion from the foods that are available from our Food Bank.

Key Facts on Foodbank

- We are 100% volunteer organization. We have no paid staff and 100% of funds raised for our organization goes to the food budget.
- During the Pandemic, in some months, our client numbers have increased by 65% over pre- Pandemic levels.
- Most of our fund raisers and food drives in 2020 and 2021 have had to be cancelled.
- In 2020, there was a significant increase in donations which assisted in purchases of food items for our increased client base. In 2021, both the number and dollar amount of donations has decreased significantly.
- In 2021 our food spend and TTC token budget has increased from \$100,000 to \$150,000. We purchase over 60% of our food requirements.
- In 2021, we anticipate that our Foodbank has supplied sufficient food to enable our clients to make over 250,000 meals.
- In addition to our twice weekly supply to clients outdoors from Timothy Eaton Memorial Church, we have created a home food delivery service to our most vulnerable clients.
- 30% of our clients are seniors, 20% of our clients are children.
- We concentrate on provide our clients with healthy options, that we purchase such as
 fresh milk, bread, yogurt and a large selection of fresh vegetables in addition to basic
 canned food items. Food parcels are prepared in advance based on family size. The number
 of families greater than three people has increased dramatically during the pandemic as
 parents were unable to continue working.

We thank the performers, sponsors, Citytv and the Churches involved in presenting this year's City Carol Sing and we thank them for their ongoing support. The cause we try to meet is very real... and growing.
