Consequently, Ancient-Future Worship is often paradoxical; characterized by form and freedom, sensibility and symbolism, structure and simplicity. Ancient-Future Worship can be both comforting and challenging, thoughtful and experiential, and private and communal. Participating worshippers describe Ancient-Future Worship as reverent, casual, contemplative, celebratory, prayerful, and thought-provoking.

Ancient-Future Worship services weave together ancient, traditional, and contemporary expressions in a service of Scripture reading and prayer – sometimes audible, sometimes silent. As we Celebrate God's Story we encounter both the immanence (closeness) and numinous (otherness) natures of God.

According to noted British theologian, Rev. Dr. David Peterson, "worship in the Bible may be viewed as a 'reciprocal exchange' between God and his people, expressed in word and action." In Ancient-Future Worship, worshipers engage actively through spoken and sung word in response to the Triune God. God is revealed through his Word and through the witness of his people.


