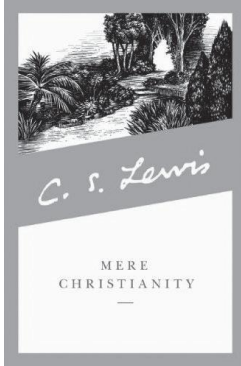
### YP GALLERY to October 27.
