Rev. T. Kerr Spiers • 1931-2011

Kerr Spiers was born in Hamilton, Lanarkshire, Scotland, on September 9 1931. His father, George Spiers, was a Baptist minister in Shotts, Glasgow and Hawick among other places, and in these towns Kerr spent his childhood and teenage years. At the age of 19 he became convinced that he, too, wanted to be a Baptist minister like his father, and studied for a degree in divinity at Rawdon Theological College in Yorkshire.

Kerr's ministry took him first to Morningside Baptist Church in Edinburgh, then to Anstruther in Fife, and then, in 1969, to Hillhead Baptist Church in Glasgow, by which point he had also become a distinguished broadcaster in Scotland. He also served as minister of Coats Memorial Baptist Church in Paisley, Scotland before coming to Yorkminster Park in 1991 to be the Minister of the Congregation.

Kerr's ministry at Yorkminster Park was marked by initiatives such as the Vision 2000 Capital Campaign as a result of which the Yorkminster Park Centre was renovated and updated. He also played a key role in the initial stages and support of The Out of the Cold ministry, the Alpha Program and our alternative hymn book. Kerr is remembered fondly for the love and kindness of his pastoral ministry and the strength of his prayers and sermons.

Kerr and Betty returned home to Glasgow in 1999 following his retirement. He continued preaching, at Glasgow Cathedral among other places, until well into his mid-70s.

Kerr died on September 28, 2011, three weeks after his 80th birthday, from the effects of a stroke suffered six months earlier. One cannot say enough about the wisdom and warmth Betty offered to Kerr in his years of ministry and the strength of her loving devotion in the months following his stroke. Kerr died peacefully, with Betty and their two children, Fiona and Graham, at his bedside.
