

Prayer with the Children

Sunday mornings the YPBC children, along with our Minister of the Congregation Rev. Dr. Peter Holmes, will take us on a tour of YPBC's beautiful stained glass windows. Each week, one of the children is assigned a window to interpret in their own way. Their insights are shared with the congregation during the Children's Prayer.

Our presenter this week is Daniela, and the window she will share portrays the Easter story of the encounter with the **Risen Christ on the Road to Emmaus**. The scripture reference is Luke 24:13-35. The story forms the central scene in the lower half of the Life of Christ window at the clerestory level of the south transept.

The window was given as a memorial to E. Frank Wright and dedicated to the glory of God in September of 1955.
