We are starting a new theme this week....



First Look – The monthly theme for May is **'God Loves Me'** and the memory verse is: "Learn to do what is right." Isaiah 1:17, NIrV.

This week the scripture is taken from Genesis 37:12-28; 41:36-56; Despite being mistreated by his brothers and thrown in jail, Joseph chooses to trust God and do the right thing. God uses Joseph to save many people, including his family, from a severe famine.

The bottom line we want to impress on our Kindergarten and Preschool children is: GOD WANTS ME TO DO THE RIGHT THING.



252 BASICS –The monthly theme is **RESPONSIBILITY**, Showing you can be trusted with what's expected of you. The memory verse is "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much." Luke 16:10, NIV. In today's lesson, the scripture is taken from Matthew 25:14-30; this is about the parable of the talents. We will focus on responding to God by giving Him our stuff, our money and our abilities. Everyone has been given something and we can choose to invest what we've been given to make a difference in the world around us. The basic truth is 'I NEED TO MAKE THE WISE CHOICE'. Prayer with the Children


