#### **Kids Care! Spring Children's Mission Project**



On April 7<sup>th</sup> the Spring Children's Mission Project was launched. In Maai Mahiu, Canadian Baptist Ministries works with farming families that have small plots of land on which they can grow crops and gardens. Families are encouraged to plant trees to replace those used for firewood and to use energy saving jikos (small cooking stoves) which use less firewood and thus reduce the rate of deforestation. But tree planting has other benefits as well:

#### Trees planted in communities help families have more food security

by helping to prevent erosion by providing fruit from the trees by replenishing nutrients in the soil by increasing food security in a whole village

#### Big change starts small.

Just \$2.50 provides a tree with the initial cost to plant, add compost and water.

That is 10 trees planted for every \$25.00!
