Tuesday, December 24, 11pm – Christmas Eve Candlelight Service A community of faith gathers together to recognize the light of Christ delivered as a little baby so long ago, and to share the light of Christ with each other and then take it into the world. It is a wonderful metaphor of the Christian walk that is incredibly renewing and unifying.

A **watchnight service** is a late-night Christian church service. It is held late on New Year's Eve, and ends after midnight. This provides the opportunity for Christians to review the year that has passed and make confession, and then prepare for the year ahead by making new commitments. There is a deep sense of blessing for many that they have begun a new year with their sisters and brothers of the Christian family in God's house.

BOARD OF MISSION

AIDS continues to be a leading cause of death in the developing world. It leaves orphans and widows/ers, some of whom are also HIV positive, and grandparents who struggle to provide for their orphaned grandchildren. CBM is helping families most impacted in Kenya, Rwanda and India through *Guardians of Hope*.
