



BOARD OF MISSION

Encouraging news from Elie and Mireille Haddad and Rupen and Mamta Das. What started as a simple prayer event last year – a couple of young people inviting others to come and pray for Lebanon – has become a whole prayer movement. Hosted by the Arab Baptist Theological Seminary, the group has grown to be in the hundreds. Earlier this year, the planning team organized a two-day public event and invited the senior pastor of a church in Cairo to come and speak. The

participation was overwhelming, with more than 1,200 people showing up each day. The speaker's challenge was to trust God and be bold in the middle of conflict – a theme which seems to be that God is preparing for the church in Lebanon. Pray that the momentum of community prayer will continue and that God's people in Lebanon will be ready to follow wherever He leads them.


An Update on 2013 Offerings

This chart shows, in weekly increments from October 6, the progress toward accomplishing the level of general offerings and contributions needed in 2013 to meet the Budget (leaving a deficit of \$144,000) or, better still, to break even.

Historically, offerings during the last few months of the year have contributed significantly to the financing of the ministries of the church. Similarly generous commitments are needed again in 2013.

As of November 10th, the general offerings yearto-date were 68% of the amount needed for the church to break even for the year.





"In Our Own Backyard" Christmas 2013 Children's Mission Project

Make a difference to people in our own city this winter.

Each year we give gifts to others out of thankfulness for all God has given us. Like last year, we have chosen to be involved locally by providing gifts for people 'in our own backyard'! We are collecting items to help a ministry here in the city.

 Or just bring a gift along and drop it in the specially marked boxes in the Centre Hall.
 (No wrapping is needed)
- Purchase a gift or several gifts suggested on the reverse of this pamphlet to be given to families in need.
- Bring the gift(s) to the church on or before December 8th, our White Gift Sunday.

Deadline! We will be collecting the items from November 17th until December 8th and they will be dedicated alongside the White Gifts that we bring on December 8th.

Note: White gifts are collected as a long standing tradition here at Yorkminster Park for Yonge Street Mission and can include food items. These will be delivered to Yonge Street Mission while toys and gifts as described on the back of this page will go to Youth Unlimited. This year, because Christmas falls on the day that we have our OUT of the COLD program at YPBC, we would like to bless our guests with small gifts. For example: small toiletries, cough lozenges, socks, mitts, bandages, tooth brushes and lip balm are all welcome gifts!
