First Look (Preschool and Kindergarten) – The monthly theme for May is "I can help others." and the memory verse is: "Be kind and loving to each other." Ephesians 4:32, NCV. This week the children will review all of the Bible stories about helpers that they covered this month.



252Basics (Grades 1 to 5) – The monthly theme is "Honesty - Choosing to be truthful in whatever you say and do". The memory verse is, "Keep me from cheating and telling lies. Be kind and teach me your law." (Psalm 119:29 NIrV) This week's lesson is about the well-known verse from 1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness".
