WE REMEMBER...

This Sunday marks the 100th anniversary of the first WWI death notice to appear in the calendar of Bloor Street Baptist church. The church membership had not been touched directly by the war to this date, but for those who remembered the children of the former Pastor, John D. Freeman, and this announcement foretold what was to come.

Word has just been received that Lance-Corporal William Darkin Freeman, the youngest son of our former pastor [John D. Freeman[1]], was killed in action in Belgium on May 15th. He enlisted for service on August 5th last, the day after war was declared. He was eighteen years and six months of age and would have received his commission as Lieutenant had he been spared a few days longer. The sympathy of the church will go out to Mr. and Mrs. Freeman, who write: "We thank God for our dear boy's beautiful life, and we regard his heroic death as a precious sacrifice on behalf of the liberties of mankind." [6 June 1915]

Such sentiments were common at the beginning of the war; they were not to last.

We remember today Lance Corporal William Darkin Freeman, aged 18.
