THE CHURCHES-ON-THE-HILL  
FOOD BANK





The Churches-on-the-Hill Food Bank was established seventeen years ago by the eight churches along the St. Clair corridor between Mount Pleasant and Spadina.

Since inception we have provided over 2 million individual meals. Today we have 655 client households (of 1 to 8 people) in our active files with the number of clients growing at a rate of 10% per year. We will distribute food sufficient for over 100,000 individual meals this year. Over 30% of the food is for children. We also have a Babies Program which provides 100% of the recommended nutrition for the key formative years from birth to age three - even diapers are provided!

The Daily Bread Food Bank, our parent organization, provides about 30% of the food distributed and another 10% comes from local food drives, church baskets and individuals. The balance of the food distributed is purchased. This year the Churches on-The-Hill Food Bank will spend over \$100,000 for food and supplies. The money comes from sponsoring churches, their congregations, the larger community and fund raising events.

We are a 100% volunteer organization. There are 132 of us who give of our time, talent and treasure to the food bank. We are located at 230 St. Clair Ave. West (Timothy Eaton Memorial Church) Toronto, ON M4V 1R5. You can contact us at **416-967-3842**.
