

The Lester Randall Preaching Fellowship was envisioned by the late, the Rev. Dr. John Gladstone and supported by a generous gift of his dear friend, Gerard H. Collins and named in honour of a great lay leader in the history of this church. Today we have five churches and eight seminaries that partner with us in the event. The Sunday and Monday evening sessions are open to the public.

YORKMINSTER BAPTIST CHURCH 1939 - 1945

Sergeant **Wallace Gale Arlidge**: Son of George Ainslie and Anne Isobel (née Wallace) of Toronto. Killed on air operations with the RCAF over Germany on July 30, 1943, at age 19. Posthumously awarded RCAF Operational Wings in recognition of gallant service in action against the enemy. Buried in Hamburg, Germany.

Sergeant **Eric Morgan Finn**: Son of Arthur James Finn and Hilda Finn of Toronto. Killed in the crash of a Liberator bomber near Dorval, Quebec, on October 20, 1943. Age 22. Buried in St Donat Roman Catholic Cemetery, Quebec.

Sergeant **William Elliott Brown**: Son of William Easson Brown and Jessie Madeleine Brown of Toronto. Killed on air operations with the RAF over Germany on July 22, 1942. Age 22. Buried in Eindhoven, The Netherlands.

Lawrence E. McCormack

Lieutenant **James Alexander Crozier Carrick**: Son of Colonel John James and Mary Jane Carrick and husband of Mercie Evelyn Carrick, of Toronto. Died at age 34 of injuries suffered in an accident while serving with the Royal Canadian Service Corps in England. Survived by two small children. Buried in Brookwood Cemetery, near London.

Sergeant **William Robert Bain Relyea**: Enlisted with the RCAF in 1940 and died on active service with the RAF on July 22 1941, at age 24. Son of William and Edna Relyea of Toronto. Buried in Waddington Churchyard, Lincolnshire, England.

Pilot Officer **Ernest Albert Wesley Dawson**: Son of Ernest and Florence Dawson, of Toronto. Enlisted in the RCAF in 1942 and was killed on air operations with the RAF over Milan, Italy, on July 13, 1944. Age 27. Buried in Milan.

Ordinary Seaman **Theodore Estabrooks Rising**: Son of William and Elsie Rising, of Toronto. Enlisted in the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve and was killed when his ship, HMS Bonaventure, was torpedoed in the Mediterranean on March 31 1941. Age 23. Commemorated on the Halifax Memorial.

Flying Officer **James Fearn**: Enlisted in the RCAF and was killed on operations with the RAF over Italy on September 18/19 1943. Buried in Naples.

Lieutenant **Franklyn Neil Zimmerman**: Died on April 14, 1945, of wounds received while on service with the Royal Canadian Engineers. Son of John Franklyn and Alma May Zimmerman, of Toronto. Age 26. Buried in Holten, The Netherlands.

PARK ROAD BAPTIST CHURCH 1939 – 1945

Flying Officer **Andrew MacFarlane Harrison Gain**: Killed on active service with the RCAF on January 15 1943. Age 19. Son of Joseph Harrison and Winifred MacFarlane Gain of Toronto. Buried in Worcestershire, England.

Pilot Officer **William Kemp Johnson**: Lost on operations while serving with the RCAF on April 18 1944. Age 22. Son of Arthur Kemp and Laura Johnson, of Toronto. Commemorated on the Runnymede Memorial in England.

John Gardiner

Pilot Officer **Roy Barrington Keedwell**: Joined the RCAF in 1939 and was attached to the RAF after receiving his wings. He was sent to the Far East and died of injuries sustained on active service. Age 24. Son of Mr and Mrs W.C. Keedwell, of Toronto. Commemorated on the Singapore Memorial.


Warrant Officer Class II **Wilber Dixon Goodrick**: Killed on active service with the RAF in India on May 12 1944. Age 24. Son of Carl Shreve and Violet Aulda Goodrick, of Toronto. Buried in Ranchi, India.

Private **Stewart George Storer**: Died on April 17 1941 of injuries sustained on active service with the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps. Son of George and May Bell Storer, and husband of Eunice Grace Irwin Storer, of Toronto. Age 34. Buried in Brookwood Cemetery, near London, England.
