**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the **Annual Business Meeting** will be held in the Heritage Room on **Sunday**, **March 24**, **2019** immediately following the morning service.

- C. A MOTION to approve on an annual basis going forward the transfer from the Endowment Fund the amount of \$20,000 for Board Discretionary expenses on the joint approval of the Board of Deacons and the Board of Finance and Administration; and \$5,000 for Deacon's Discretionary expenses as approved by the Board of Deacons.
