THE HONOURABLE DAVID C. ONLEY

STATE FUNERAL | MONDAY JANUARY 30, 11:00 A.M.



People have been asking about Monday's State Funeral for our dear friend the Honourable David C. Onley. David will lie in state at Queen's Park on Saturday, January 28 from noon until 5 p.m. and on Sunday, January 29 from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m.

For those planning to attend the service at Yorkminster Park on Monday at 11 a.m., please be aware of the following:

- In advance of the funeral, St. Clair Avenue East will be closed from Mount Pleasant to Yonge Street. Yonge Street will also be closed from St. Clair north to the church. The road closures are to accommodate the military cortege escorting the casket to the church along those same roads.
- There will be no parking at the church and street parking will be limited. Green P parking will be available in the lot which is accessible off Heath St. West and Delisle. The Green P parking lot on Alvin will be closed in order to accommodate police and military vehicles. Alternative means of transportation such as the TTC, taxi, or uber should be considered.
- The doors to the church will open at 9 a.m. There will be approximately 500 seats reserved for invited dignitaries, the extended family, and friends of the family. Remaining seats will be open to the public on a first come first served basis. The balconies will not be open until the downstairs is full. Monitors in the Chapel and Cameron Hall will allow for additional overflow seating.
- Those entering the church with mobility devices are asked to please use the Yorkminster Park Centre Doors.
- The Yonge Street doors will be closed at 10:30 a.m. to receive the casket with military escort, family and other dignitaries. The Narthex will be closed from 10:30 onwards.
- Those without visible disabilities arriving after 10:30 a.m. must enter the church through the tower door on Heath Street or the corresponding door on the opposite side near the digital sign.
- Please make every effort to arrive prior to 11 a.m. We are doing all we can to keep the service under 90 minutes.
- The service will conclude as the family follows the casket out of the church. They will travel to Mount Pleasant Cemetery for a private Interment. ***There will not be a reception following the service.***
- The service will be webcast on the [church website](#).
- It may also be carried live on one or both of the networks on which David served as a broadcast journalist; CITYtv or CP24.

This information is intended to aid you in your visit to the church for David's funeral. We strongly encourage you to come if you are able so that in their hour of grief the Onley family will know they are surrounded by the love and prayers of their church family.

It is wonderful the way so many have stepped up to volunteer to help and that the choir has offered to sing. Thank you to one and all. It is a privilege to serve such a kind and compassionate community.

It is also a privilege to host this service as an opportunity for us to give thanks for David's remarkable life and faith.
