In 1974, the Choir sang the Duruflé Requiem under the direction of Giles Bryant, and were accompanied by Marie-Madeleine Duruflé-Chevalier, wife of the composer. It was originally intended that Maurice Duruflé would conduct, but illness precluded him from coming on tour with Mme Duruflé. Her registrations for the Yorkminster Park organ on that occasion were written down and preserved by Catherine Palmer, and are those which are used to accompany the Sanctus today.

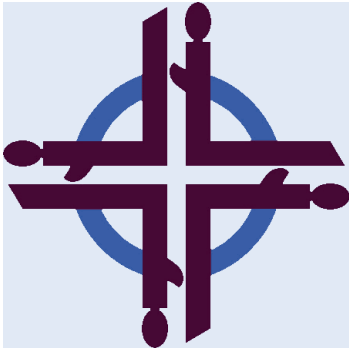
CHURCHES ON THE HILL FOODBANK

Yorkminster Park has a long history of sponsoring refugee families and at their meeting on February 18, 2015 the Board of Mission approved a motion to sponsor a new refugee family and to make refugee sponsorship an ongoing program of the Church. Refugees throughout the world live in terrible circumstances and our objective is to bring families to a safe and secure place, and to give them every possible support as they strive to make a living here and to become part of Canadian society. Sponsorship entails a one-year commitment of funding and support for a family once they have arrived and we ask for your prayerful support of this Ministry. Donations may be made using envelopes (marked Refugee Fund) and once our sponsored family arrives we will need many volunteers to help with housing, clothing, schooling, medical assistance and other needs.
