

BOARD OF FINANCE UPDATE

We were blessed to receive a very generous special offering at the end of September and we thank God for people who are moved to give of their treasures to support the work at YPBC in this way. This gift and other generous gifts have positively impacted our financial position.

However, there has been a significant decrease in weekly offerings to the General Fund and we are \$51,669.61 under budget year to date. Our weekly offerings provide the stable base for funding our programs and services. In addition, the expenses for maintenance and utilities for the premises are increasing and we are \$51,255.53 over budget year to date. This situation presents a challenge as we commence the budgeting process and look ahead to funding God's work at YPBC. We need to see our regular weekly offerings to the General Fund increase.

We are grateful for the generous support to Missions which allows us to give more to our mission programs and partners. Missions' revenue and expenses express the ongoing commitment of the congregation at YPBC to serve others.
