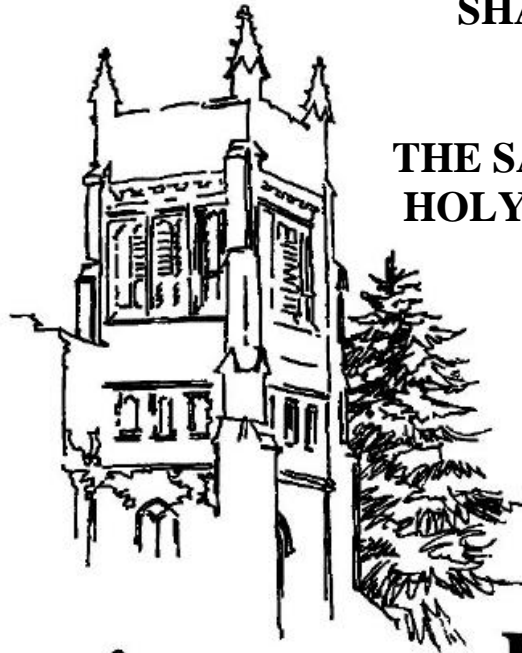

PLEASE NOTE

The York School opened their new Junior School Campus at 1639 Yonge Street on September 13th. For the past 18 months the school has been working with various levels of municipal government and the community to have student drop-off and pickup made with a minimal amount of disruption.

In an effort to ease congestion, we have entered into an agreement with The York School to allow Grade 4 & 5 families to use our parking lot as a **one-way laneway northbound from Heath Street to Glen Elm Ave between the hours of 8:00am to 8:30am as well as 3:30pm to 4:00pm**. Vehicles will then turn left onto Glen Elm and immediately right into the private laneway heading north to the school where students will be dropped-off and picked up.

The York School will have a minimum of 2 staff members in our parking lot during the morning and afternoon periods to co-ordinate the flow of traffic. In addition, the school has contracted to have a police officer on duty to help manage the situation.

The City has made 2 important changes that drivers should be aware of:

- There is now “No Parking” along our northern boundary on Glen Elm between 8am & 6pm
- Cars travelling north on Yonge Street will now be permitted to turn right on to Glen Elm.

We ask that if you are entering our parking lot during the times mentioned above, that you do so via the Heath Street entrance which will have the gate open and will be monitored by a York School staff member. This will greatly assist the smooth flow of traffic northbound onto Glen Elm.

We do not anticipate any disruption to our programmes during these times but we will be monitoring the situation closely.

The STEP (Serving, Training, Energizing Partnerships) Lebanon "Fact-Finders" are very excited about our Short Term Mission trip to Beirut, September 26-October 5 on behalf of YPBC. Our church partnership is with the Lebanese Society for Educational and Social Development (LSESD – also known as the Lebanese Baptist Society), an "umbrella" for the Arab Baptist Seminary, the Beirut Baptist School, Youth and Children's Ministries, a publishing house and Lebanese Baptist Aid (Rupen Das). We are so looking forward to listening, learning, and building relationships with the leaders in Beirut as together we discern God's will for our 25% focus of the STEP \$10,000/year commitment. (Canadian Baptist Ministries designates 75 %.) We know that we cannot do this in our own strength nor without your prayers and so we ask you to prayerfully cover us, day and night during our time away. A commissioning service will be held in the morning service on Sunday September 26 and your presence will be such an encouragement to us as your representatives.

We ask this of you with gratefulness for your sharing in this wonderful privilege to partner, as a church, with these leaders of excellence and as a result, to be encouraged toward a more passionate discipleship and missional lifestyle, locally and globally.
