Blessings of the Cross: A Lenten Bible Study Based on the Revised Common Lectionary

Robert Martin Walker, Author

The Blessings of Risk-taking

Genesis 12: 1-4a Romans 4:1-5, 13-17 John 3:1-17

The second week of Lent brings with it the challenge to take a risk. We are asked to believe that when we take certain risks God blesses us with a deeper and stronger faith in God. In the Genesis text we encounter Abram a man who risk everything; to leave his land, the circumstances of his birth and his father's house in response to the request of God. We should discover in this story that the promised blessings, called the Abrahamic Covenant, were not earned by Abram and cannot be earned by us. We must trust God as Abram did. "Trusting always includes an element of risk, especially when we cannot be certain of the trustworthiness of whom or what we are trusting."

The Apostle Paul picks up on this theme and uses it to remind us that faith is 'radical trust' and that it was and is that kind of faith that is at the heart of our relationship with God. Our author boldly declares, "Where there is no trust, there is no relationship." Nothing could be truer. In Jesus Christ we see God who is all together lovely; all together worthy of our trust and our faith.

When Nicodemus went out to meet Jesus in our gospel text; he was unsure how much to trust; he was 'in the dark.' Yet he took a risk and asked some questions until he was surer. Those risks 'in the dark' become a demonstration in the light of day and a faithful trusting of Jesus Christ for salvation. In the journey of life that we take during these forty days, let us take risks, step outside of our comfort zone, ask some questions and receive not only answers but also assurances from God.
