## **NEW MEMBERS:**

**Shara Benavidez** was born in Cochabamba, Bolivia and raised in a devout Baptist Christian family which included three brothers and one sister. Shara's father, an Engineer by training, is the President of the Bolivian Baptist Convention. Her mother, besides being actively involved in her church, has a passionate interest in assisting women to be skilled in various crafts, thus making them more economically self-sufficient. Because of her father's work, it was necessary for the family to move frequently. They always became involved in the nearest Baptist Church.
