Dr. Victor Shepherd is Professor of Theology at Tyndale University College & Seminary, Toronto, and Adjunct Professor of Theology, University of Toronto as well as *Professor Ordinarius* at the University of Oxford, U.K. He is an ordained minister of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. He is the author of eleven books and over three hundred journal articles that reflect his extensive pastoral and academic experience. A long-time advocate for the mentally ill and the underhoused, he has served on the board of the Peel Mental Health Housing Coalition and Pathway Community Developments. Dr. Shepherd is married to Maureen McGuigan, a retired French Immersion teacher. They have two daughters and five grandchildren. They live in Mississauga, Ontario.

Rev. Dr. Paul Scott Wilson will be with us, and preaching at morning services from Sept. 11 until October 2.

This morning we are pleased to welcome *Rev. John R. Torrance* as he assumes the role of Interim Senior Minister. 
