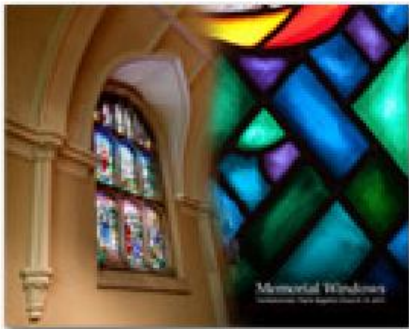

Prayer with the Children

Sunday mornings the YPBC children, along with our Minister of the Congregation Rev. Dr. Peter Holmes, will take us on a tour of YPBC's beautiful stained glass windows. Dr. Holmes is preaching a series of sermons entitled, 'Written in Glass,' based on the texts of Scripture related to our stained glass windows. Each week the children take turns telling the story related to the window during the Prayer with the Children.

Our presenter this week is Sophie, and the window she will share depicts the story of **Jesus stilling the storm on the Sea of Galilee**, which was chosen for this Remembrance Sunday as 'storm' is commonly used as a metaphor during times of war. The story of the stilling of the storm is portrayed in one of the nave clerestory (upper level) windows on the south side. It was installed and dedicated in May 31, 1998 and it is in memory of Ida Annie Rudlin (1877-1954) and Florence Mary Rudlin (1902-1995).
