

Prayer with the Children

Sunday mornings the YPBC children, along with our
Minister of the Congregation Rev. Dr. Peter Holmes, will take us
on a tour of YPBC's beautiful stained glass windows.

Each week, one of the children is assigned a window to interpret
in their own way. Their insights are shared with the congregation
during the Children's Prayer.

Our presenter this week is Cameron, and the window he will share features a scene from Christ's passion with **Jesus** carrying the cross. The scripture is John 12:20-33.

The window is in our Heritage Room as part of our collection of stained glass windows saved from Park Road Baptist Church after the fire in 1961. Following the fire the congregation of Park Road merged with Yorkminster to form Yorkminster Park Baptist Church.

The window was given to honour the memory of Daniel Edmund Thomson (1850-1925) and Elizabeth Hosking Thomson (1850-1932).





This week our children are learning.....



First Look – The monthly theme is **'Love EVERYONE'** and the memory verse is: "Love each other as I have loved you." John 15:12, NIV. This week the scripture is taken from *Matthew 4:18-22; 28:16-20; John 1:35-45.* Jesus picked some special friends to help Him spread the good news that He loves everyone. The disciples tell others.



252 BASICS –The monthly theme is **Rooted: Standing strong in God's truth.** The memory verse is 'Never tire of doing what is right', II *Thessalonians 3:13, NIV.* In today's lesson, we'll talk about Daniel in the lions' den as told in *Daniel 6.* What does it take to be able to make wise choices and treat others the way we want to be treated, over and over, through the years? We need a deep relationship with God so He's constantly fuelling us and encouraging us to become more and more like Him. So this week we're also focusing on praying or talking with God several times a day. The basic truth is 'I need to make a wise choice'.
