MINISTERIAL REPLACEMENT COMMITTEE

In keeping with its responsibilities under the church's constitution and to fill the current vacancy of the Minister of Pastoral Care, The Board of Deacons wish to advise the congregation that a Ministerial Replacement Committee has been formed. The MRC will fulfill its responsibilities by consulting with the Canadian Baptists of Ontario and Quebec and other organizations in order to invite appropriate applications or recommendations for the position.

The process will encompass several stages including advertising, interviews and negotiations as the committee seeks to identify the person of God's choosing to fulfill this call. Eventually the committee will identify a candidate to be approved by the Board of Deacons before being passed on as a formal recommendation to the congregation. The work of the committee is of a highly confidential matter and so while they will not be in a position to release substantial information regarding their process they do treasure the trust and prayers of the people of the church.
