
An Update on Offerings in 2012

As was noted in the Calendar two weeks ago, the financial results of YPBC to September 30 were ahead of budget, although the Church had a substantial deficit (operating loss) for the nine months to that date.

The chart opposite shows, in weekly increments from September 30, the progress toward accomplishing the level of general offerings needed in 2012 in order to meet the budget (leaving a deficit of \$82,100) or, better still, to break-even.

Historically, offerings during the last few months of the year have contributed significantly to the financing of the ministries of the Church. Similar commitments are needed again in 2012.

We plan to include an update of this chart in the Calendar each Sunday for the rest of the year.
