


The December 2012 YPBC News is available **online**, and there are limited copies in the Centre Hall, Narthex and the table near the Heath Street door.

An Update on Offerings in 2012

The chart opposite shows, in weekly increments from September 30, the progress toward accomplishing the level of general offerings and contributions needed in 2012 in order to meet the Budget (leaving a deficit of \$82,100) or, better still, to break-even.

As of December 16, the general offerings in the year to date were 89% of the amount needed for the Church to break even for the year.

Historically, offerings during the last few weeks of the year have contributed significantly to the financing of the ministries of the Church. Similarly generous commitments are needed again during the last half of December.


