




A DEVOTIONAL SERIES LED BY JOHN FRANKLIN

John is linked with a large network of Christian artists across Canada and internationally. Prior to Imago he was professor of philosophy at Tyndale

College and has been adjunct in theology at Tyndale Seminary and Trinity College Toronto School of Theology. His special interest is the intersection between art, faith and theology. He also serves as Chair of Lausanne Canada and Co-ordinator of the Task Force on Arts in Mission for the Mission Commission of the World Evangelical Alliance. He publishes Imago's quarterly newsletter.
