Mission Statement

The purpose of Music Mission Kiev is to bring the sacred masterpieces of classical music to the country of Ukraine, proclaiming the Gospel TO and THROUGH Ukrainian musicians to the world, and ministering to the emerging Christian community in Ukraine through evangelism, discipleship, music education, and humanitarian outreach to widows, orphans, refugees and families of St. Paul's Church.

In a culture where heroes traditionally are writers, poets, and musicians, communism invaded a continent, preaching atheism and forbidding artistic expression of any religious subject. The communists knew too well how music stirs the soul, and the nation of Ukraine descended into seventy years of spiritual darkness. Believers were persecuted and killed. Many, including Wes Janzen's grandparents, fled the country.

Although Ukraine threw off the oppression of communism in 1991, it is still crippled economically and spiritually. But now, music is piercing the darkness



that caused so much suffering. Today the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra and Chorus presents great Christian masterpieces and programs of sacred Christmas music, whose message brings hope to the Ukrainian soul. Deeply dedicated to their musical craft, Ukrainian musicians are among the finest in the world. One of our musicians wrote: *"We are singing the Word of God. Our concerts are more like worship services than ordinary concerts."* A professor of conducting at the Kiev Conservatory of Music, after hearing a concert, wrote: *"All I could see was Light. And I knew I had to be near that Light."*

In 1996, after performing many concerts in Kyiv, the KSOC took its first tour to North America. Since then, we've toured NA many times, visiting western Canada for the first time in 2012. In these concerts we perform a variety of music, exposing listeners to the extraordinary talent of these professional musicians, as well as inform them about the ministry work in Ukraine through MMK.

Our vision is to bring growth, stability and permanence to the community of Christians in Ukraine and to equip and send Ukrainian Christian leaders to proclaim the glorious Gospel of Jesus Christ and His Kingdom – with music as a catalyst – to even more people in the former Soviet Republics.

Today the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra and Chorus also has glorious opportunities to share the gospel in former Soviet countries, some now under strict Moslem control. In 2006 the KSOC began reaching a new audience performing Handel's *Messiah* in the Russian language in central Russia, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan. Singers from KSOC have returned numerous times with Roger to Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan, at the invitation of the Kyrgyz State Chamber Orchestra. Our musicians are able to reach these Moslem nations with the Gospel where missionaries are not welcome.

In Ukraine, KSOC concerts are frequently "friendship evangelism" events, in local churches, where invited Ukrainians and

others clearly experience a vibrant Gospel presentation through glorious music. It is an enormous privilege to partner with a rapidly emerging community of Christians in post-communist Ukraine.

Kyiv Symphony Orchestra and Chorus Conductor, Wes Janzen

During the Soviet times many Christian masterpieces were forbidden, amended or given little attention. After Ukraine gained independence the following works were presented by the KSOC, many as premiers: Mendelssohn *Elijah*, Bach *St. Matthew* and *St. John Passion*, Menotti *Amahl and the Night Visitors*, *Requiems* by Verdi, Mozart, Brahms, Berlioz, Faure and Durufle, Walton *Belshazzar's Feast*, Mendelssohn *Lobgesang*, Bernstein *Chichester Psalms*, Haydn *Creation*, and Bach *B minor Mass* and *Magnificat*, to name just a few.

KSOC also delights in performing jewels of Slavic music, and through over 425 concerts in North America has introduced many of these to thousands of appreciative listeners. Composers include Tchaikovsky, Prokofiev, Rimsky-Korsakov, Mussorgsky, Borodin, Chesnokov, Vedel, Berezovsky, Leontovych, Arkhangelsky, Bortniansky, Lesenko, and Rachmaninov.

KSOC performs many sacred masterpieces in their original language, but also uses translations into Ukrainian and Russian, to make the texts easy to understand. Thus, we perform Handel's *Messiah* in English (original language) as well as in Ukrainian and Russian. You will hear some evidence of this remarkable linguistic skill today.

KSOC most recently participated in an international all staff Agape (called Cru in USA and Power to Change in Canada) conference in Tallin, Estonia, which included national television and radio broadcasts. Speakers included Josh McDowell. Estonia was chosen because it is the least reached European country with the gospel. After one of several KSOC concerts, a senior staff member wrote; "We felt like we were bathed in prayer and the love of Christ."

Kimberley Janzen (soprano) is Associate Director of Outreach Ministries for Music Mission Kiev. She taught voice at Trinity Western University for 20 years and has made several appearances as soloist with Vancouver Symphony Orchestra. Kim is a popular speaker and soloists in a variety of settings, including Kyiv. She served as worship leader for Missions Fest Vancouver for many years before moving to Kyiv. Her CD, made with Edward Norman, featuring his sensitive and original piano accompaniments is entitled "Joy — Songs of Jesus and His Great Commission." It was fully sponsored so that all proceeds could support the ministry of MMK. Wonderful hymns of the faith and hymn medleys have garnered rave reviews.

Wes Janzen is President of Music Mission Kiev and Conductor and Artistic Director of the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra and Chorus. He has frequently collaborated with Vancouver Chamber Choir, CBC Radio Orchestra and Vancouver Symphony Orchestra. Choirs under his direction have been heard in

dozens of CBC and European Broadcasting Network broadcasts. Prof. Dr. Janzen has served on the jury for many of Europe's most important choral competitions and is listed in Germany's "Who's Who in Choral Music." He has worked extensively with Krystoff Penderecki in Poland and studied and toured with Eric Ericson, Stockholm, Sweden. He served as scholar in residence at Helmuth Rilling's Oregon Bach Festival, assisting in the preparation of Penderecki's monumental *St. Luke Passion*, which was conducted by the composer. For 33 years he taught at TWU and for many years served as music coordinator for Missions Fest Vancouver. Personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ is the value that Wes and Kimberley Janzen most cherish.

Viktoriia Konchakovska, Assistant Conductor of the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra and Chorus graduated from the Kyiv State University of Culture and the Arts. She has worked with the KSOC since 1993. Her musical and organizational genius and hard work are two of the reasons KSOC enjoys such great success. This past season

Viktoriia conducted KSOC performances of Mendelssohn *Elijah* and Rachmaninoff *Vespers* in Kyiv to rave reviews.

Alina Sinelnikova (soprano) is a graduate of the Tchaikovsky National Music Academy of Ukraine where she won the top prize in the vocal category. She has won prizes and diplomas at international and All-Ukrainian competitions. She has sung frequent solo roles with KSOC, most recently in Tallin, Estonia. She is currently enrolled in a post-graduate program at the Tchaikovsky National Music Academy of Ukraine.

In 2011, soprano **Yulia Merkurdinova** graduated from the Department of Vocal Art at the P. I. Tchaikovsky Music College in Simferopol and entered the Tchaikovsky National Music Academy of Ukraine in Kyiv. Currently, she continues to pursue a degree in solo singing at this Academy. She has won prizes at the Petrusenko Vocal Competition (2nd prize) and the international competition called *The Embroidered Towels of Krolevets* (1st prize). Yulia is part of a wonderful Music Mission Kiev outreach to refugees. Yulia has

charmed these fellow citizens with her friendly musical charm and acts of grace.

Twin sisters **Katerina and Darina Rugol**, who formed a bandura duo, have received training from Glier Music College and Tchaikovsky National Music Academy of Ukraine in Kyiv. They are currently enrolled in the Master's program at this academy. They have won prizes at numerous Ukrainian and international competitions. They have toured in France, Poland, Austria and other countries. Also known as Katia and Dasha, they too are part of a wonderful Music Mission Kiev outreach to refugees, including children, and have won their hearts through their kindness, service and beautiful music.

The poorest of the poor in Kiev are the pensioners. Most of these are widows. A tiny pension from the government does not keep up with rising food costs, and an apartment tax consumes much of the widow's pension. Pensioners with medical needs are expected to bear the costs of care and medications, and most do not have these funds. Though children are supposed to take care of their elderly parents, many do not, for a variety of reasons: some are pensioners themselves, some are invalids, some alcoholics, unemployed or simply uncaring. Many of our widows have no family. Where there is no assistance, Music Mission Kiev comes with basic medical care, the love of Jesus Christ, spiritual nurturing, Bible teaching, Christian fellowship and a weekly food packet.

In 2001 MMK launched personal evangelism training programs for widows, teachers, musicians and others, to share their Christian faith with other adults, teens and children.

In 2004 a unique ministry began with our elderly caring for the homebound pensioners. They bring a weekly food packet, read the Bible, pray and provide fellowship and helpful work such as cooking, cleaning and getting medicine from the drugstore.



The widows appreciate your prayers. Among the most requested are prayers for the salvation of their friends and loved ones, for their health, for their continued faithfulness to the Lord, for their church and for Ukraine. We also ask that you pray for our staff who care for 380 widows, which is a significant responsibility.

MMK serves every week in school #22 where many orphans attend. We bring weekly choir, hand-bell and Bible lessons. We also bring some of our most loving and talented widows, skilled in knitting and other handcrafts, who teach these and other life skills to these needy children.

Our newest ministry came out of the invasion and war that is happening in south and east Ukraine. We now care for a growing number of refugees who have fled the fighting. Some have been tortured while held prisoner by terrorists. Substantial weekly food and living supply deliveries plus music, Bible, and English lessons are warmly received by these beautiful people.
