We are honoured to welcome the **Rev. Dr. Barbara Mutch** back to our pulpit as part of the Lester Randall Preaching Fellowship. Barbara serves as the Vice President Academic, Director of the Doctor of Ministry Studies and is the Charles Bentall Professor of Pastoral Studies at Carey Theological College which is on the campus of University British Columbia. Barbara takes particular delight in helping others explore what it means to make a life in the way of Jesus, hunting the connections between God's Word and God's people, cultivating a spirituality that sustains a life of following Jesus, and integrating beliefs with the practice of ministry. Barbara will be preaching, offering a keynote address and leading a workshop at the LRPF on Monday and Tuesday. Let us keep Barbara and others who will be leading in our prayers.

We are delighted to welcome **Morten Lauridsen** to worship today. Morten Lauridsen is an American composer whose music has a global impact. A National Medal of Arts recipient (2007), he has been a professor of composition at the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music for more than 40 years. Morten grew up in the Pacific North-West. In 2006 Lauridsen was named an 'American Choral Master' by the National Endowment for the Arts. In 2007, he received the National Medal of Arts from the President in a White House ceremony, "for his composition of radiant choral works combining musical beauty, power and spiritual depth that have thrilled audiences worldwide." Yesterday we had the joy of hosting the Shining Night Festival featuring a film of his life and music and a gala concert with the Yorkminster Park choirs, the Orpheus Choir, the Exultate Singers, The MacMillan Singers, the Cawthra Park School Chamber Choir and the Talisker Players. Morten, thank you and God be with you.

MINISTERIAL REPLACEMENT COMMITTEE



An Update on 2014 Offerings 1,500,000

This chart shows, in weekly increments 1,250,000 from September 28th, the progress toward accomplishing the level of general offerings and contributions needed in 2014 to meet the Budget (leaving a deficit of \$55,455) or better still, to break even. Last year we were able to break even. Similarly generous commitments are needed again in 2014.

As of October 20, the general offerings year-to-date were 63% of the amount needed for the church to break even for the year.
