
Book Lovers! Mystery Buffs! Fans of Ellis Portal! An Evening with Rosemary Aubert

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

What's Up in Children's Ministries

Did you know that the curriculum in Children's Ministries for Preschool and Kindergarten children is called **First Look** and for school age it is called **252Basics**. Each month in this space we will let you know what our kids are learning so you can pray for them and encourage them!

In October, the theme in First Look is 'God can help me be brave'. The memory verse is "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid ... for the Lord your God goes with you." Deuteronomy 31:6, NIV.

The stories this month include parts of the life of Gideon, Miriam, Hezekiah, and Daniel and how God helped each one be brave.

This month in 252 Basics the children are learning about **individuality.** That is 'discovering who you are meant to be so you can make a difference'. Their memory verse is "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young. Set an example for the believers in what you say and in how you live." 1 Timothy 4:12a, New International Revised Version. We know that if we teach kids to find purpose now, they'll grow up knowing the even greater potential God has for them in the future. This was actually what Paul did for Timothy. The children will look at passages in 1 Timothy and 1 Corinthians 12:12-21, 25-27.

OUT OF THE COLD

On **Wednesday**, **November 4**, **2015**, we will once again open our weekly Out of the Cold drop-in centre for those needing food and temporary shelter. Our program runs from the first Wednesday evening/Thursday morning of November to the first Wednesday evening/Thursday morning of April.

We served many overnight guests last year and met their needs for shelter, warmth, food and companionship during a particularly brutal winter. Now we must ask that you help us meet our needs for new funds for the 2015/16 season. We are very grateful for the ongoing support of our caring congregation. This will be our 23rd year serving the homeless.

There is a particular need for volunteers on the overnight shift (11pm-6am) and the breakfast service/clean-up (6am-8 am). For the breakfast shift, we need 8 people to help in the kitchen once per month, and also 4 strong people keen to get their morning gym workout at the same time as serving in ministry.
