The trip is from July 30 to August 4 (accommodation at Fanshawe College for the week). We are looking for volunteers who love children and love to serve. In particular, he enjoys the teaching in the Berean class and the warm fellowship there. Steven is trusting that the Lord will use him in His service among His people here at Y.P.B.C.

Brennan grew up in the United Church. He became active in church life in grade 7 in the Youth Group when a new pastor came to his church. Brennan's faith started to blossom in university when he became connected with his mentors.
