Rather than distributing the elements in the traditional way, upon arrival worshippers will be given the bread and cup in a sealed package which they will be invited to open, eat, and drink at the appropriate time in the service.

Below are instructions on how to safely access the wafer and the cup.

The container has a clear film top that reveals the wafer compartment.



Hint: Bending the tab downward to snap will release the airtight seal on the film and make the edge very easy to find and open.



Open Wafer: Lift the your wafer.



Open Cup: Open the film to open and receive cup by peeling back the tab on the foil seal to



The Rev. Dr. Ray F. Kibler III is a retired Lutheran pastor residing in Claremont California where he serves as Chair of the Faith and Order Commission of the Southern California Christian Forum of the National Council of Churches, and Scholar of the History of Christianity with Ecumenical Theology and History. He has pastored a number of churches in Southern California and served as Professor of Research on the faculty of a Lutheran college in California. Ray holds the B.Mus. degree cum laude from California State University, Long Beach, the M.Div and M.Th degrees from Luther Seminary, a Doctor of Ministry degree from the Claremont School of Theology, and a Ph.D. from Fuller Theological Seminary. Due to a medical disability Ray has been confined largely to his home for more than ten years but continues to serve via electronic means.

After a friend told him about Yorkminster Park he searched for us online and has been worshipping with us ever since. More recently Ray has become active in our mid-week online Bible Study and we have been blessed by his participation.

Rev. Jim Sanderson has been pastor of Mimico Baptist Church (MBC) since November 1994. He is married to Jennifer and they have three grown children, Jesse, Jillian, and Jemma. Jim loves the outdoors, kayaking, fishing, hiking, snowshoeing. He loves his church and community. MBC is particularly excited about their vibrant Mandarin Ministry and their other focus on children and youth. Jim trained four years to be an illustrator, served one year with Inter Varsity Christian Fellowship, and three years as a director of a ministry to young offenders and troubled youth. He completed his MDiv at Tyndale University. Prior to coming to Mimico, Jim served as associate pastor at First Baptist Church Ingersoll and Pastor of Beachville Baptist Church.
