



As part of this year's efforts, **Daily Bread Food Bank** is once again partnering with **Purolator** for the Toronto Red Bag campaign. Now in its seventh year, 20,000 red bags have been distributed to homes in key neighbourhoods for residents to fill with non-perishable food donations. Aiming to raise 50,000 lbs of food, the **Red Bag initiative** is part of the Purolator Tackle Hunger® National Red Bag Campaign, which supports families facing food insecurity across Canada. # A PERFECT STORM: THE IMPACT OF THE POSTAL STRIKE AND TARIFFS ON FOOD BANKS

Charities such as the Daily Bread Food Bank are expressing concerns over the impact another Canada Post strike will have on donations around Thanksgiving. Many receive mailed donations, some of which are large. DBFB CEO Neil Hetherington was interviewed on CP24 and said, "This strike has a painful impact on our operations. About 25 per cent of what we need to help those who are food insecure, one in ten Torontonians, comes by mail. Because of the rising demand, we encourage online donations and monthly support if possible at dailybread.ca."

There is another large shadow impacting food banks in a time of increased demand - tariffs. How do they affect the needy?:

**Increased Food Costs:** Tariffs are a tax on imported goods, which leads to higher prices on commonly stocked food items like peanut butter, rice, and pasta.

Financial Hardship for Families: Tariffs contribute to job losses and reduced working hours in key sectors, increasing financial strain on low- and middle-income families and making it harder for them to afford food, thereby increasing food insecurity.

Increased Demand on Services: As families struggle with rising costs, food banks experience a surge in people needing their services. Reduced Donations: With increased financial pressure on donors, both cash and food donations to food banks may decrease.
