

Hymns – December 21st 2025 Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols ***Processional Hymn 81** - Once in royal David's city

- 1 Once in royal David's city stood a lowly cattle shed, where a mother laid her baby in a manger for his bed:
 Mary was that mother mild,
 Jesus Christ her little child.
- 2 He came down to earth from heaven who is God and Lord of all, and his shelter was a stable, and his cradle was a stall; with the poor and mean and lowly lived on earth our Saviour holy.
- * 3 And through all his wondrous childhood he would honour and obey, love and watch the lowly maiden, in whose gentle arms he lay: Christian children all must be mild, obedient, good as he.

- * 4 For he is our childhood's pattern, day by day like us he grew, he was little, weak, and helpless, tears and smiles like us he knew; and he feeleth for our sadness, and he shareth in our gladness.
- 5 And our eyes at last shall see him, through his own redeeming love, for that child so dear and gentle is our Lord in heaven above; and he leads his children on to the place where he is gone.
- 6 Not in that poor lowly stable, with the oxen standing by, we shall see him; but in heaven, set at God's right hand on high; where like stars his children crowned all in white shall wait around.

*Congregational Hymn 45 - O come, o come, Emmanuel

1 O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here, until the Son of God appear:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee. O Israel.

- 2 O come, thou Rod of Jesse, free thine own from Satan's tyranny; from depths of hell thy people save, and give them victory o'er the grave:
- 3 O come, thou Dayspring, come and cheer our spirits by thine advent here; disperse the gloomy clouds of night, and death's dark shadows put to flight:
- 4 O come, thou Key of David, come, and open wide our heavenly home; make safe the way that leads on high, and close the path to misery:
- 5 O come, O come, thou Lord of Might, who to thy tribes, on Sinai's height, in ancient times didst give the law in cloud and majesty and awe:

*Congregational Hymn 79 - O little town of Bethlehem

- 1 O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by: yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting Light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.
- 2 O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth, and praises sing to God the King, and peace to men on earth. For Christ is born of Mary; and, gathered all above, while mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love.
- 3 How silently, how silently, the wondrous gift is given! so God imparts to human hearts the blessings of his heaven.
 No ear may hear his coming; but in this world of sin, where meek souls will receive him, still the dear Christ enters in.
- 4 O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray;
 cast out our sin, and enter in: be born in us today.
 We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell:
 O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel.

*Congregational Hymn 89 - While shepherds watched

- 1 While shepherds watched their flocks by night, all seated on the ground, the angel of the Lord came down, and glory shone around.
- 2 'Fear not,' said he (for mighty dread had seized their troubled mind); 'glad tidings of great joy I bring to you and all mankind.
- 3 'To you in David's town this day is born of David's line a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord; and this shall be the sign:
- 4 'the heavenly babe you there shall find to human view displayed, all meanly wrapped in swathing bands, and in a manger laid.'
- 5 Thus spake the seraph; and forthwith appeared a shining throng of angels praising God, who thus addressed their joyful song:
- 6 'All glory be to God on high, and to the earth be peace; good will henceforth from heaven to men begin and never cease.'

*Congregational Hymn 66 - Hark! The herald angels sing

1 Hark! the herald angels sing glory to the new-born King, peace on earth and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled.

Joyful, all ye nations rise, join the triumph of the skies; with the angelic host proclaim, 'Christ is born in Bethlehem.'

Hark, the herald angels sing glory to the new-born King.

- 2 Christ, by highest heaven adored, Christ, the everlasting Lord, late in time behold him come, offspring of a Virgin's womb! Veiled in flesh the Godhead see: Hail, the incarnate Deity, pleased as man with man to dwell, Jesus, our Emmanuel.
- 3 Hail, the heaven-born Prince of Peace! Hail, the Sun of Righteousness! Light and life to all he brings, risen with healing in his wings. Mild he lays his glory by, born that man no more may die, born to raise the sons of earth, born to give them second birth.

*Recessional Hymn 83 - See amidst the winter's snow

1 See, amid the winter's snow, born for us on earth below, see, the Lamb of God appears, promised from eternal years!

Hail, thou ever-blessèd morn!
Hail, redemption's happy dawn!
Sing through all Jerusalem:
Christ is born in Bethlehem!

- 2 Lo, within a manger lies he who built the starry skies, he who, throned in height sublime, sits amid the cherubim!
- * 3 Say, ye holy shepherds, say, what your joyful news today; wherefore have ye left your sheep on the lonely mountain steep?
- * 4 'As we watched at dead of night, lo, we saw a wondrous light; angels, singing "Peace on earth," told us of a Saviour's birth.'
 - 5 Sacred Infant, all divine, what a tender love was thine, thus to come from highest bliss down to such a world as this!
