Christmas Truce Service (Special WWI Liturgy) with RH Thomson

This afternoon's CHRISTMAS TRUCE SERVICE features letters home from the front conveying the wonder and power of the Christmas Truce of 1914. The readings and narration are offered by the legendary Canadian actor RH Thomson who also co-authored the liturgy. Anthony Varahidis and Alex Loschberger sing carols as they were sung from the trenches a century ago as the Christmas story is read between carols, anthems and prayers.

Randall Speller who attended the service when it was first presented on Christmas Eve 2014 wrote, "From a time 100 years ago, when WWI was destroying a generation, this is surely one of the more original, moving, and inspiring Christmas messages that you will hear this season." Another friend, Carol Radford Grant offered this reflection after first seeing the Christmas Truce Service, "The Christmas Truce was a series of unofficial ceasefires along the Western Front beginning on Christmas Eve 1914. The Christmas Truce Service tells this story through words of the soldiers who experienced it. Hearing their letters read brings an immediacy to this part of WWI and nurtures our own experience of Christmas." As a result of many comments like these, the timeless message of the Christmas Truce is being celebrated again this Christmas. I hope you can join us.
